


#### **Main Components**

The Sheriffs' and Constables' Fees tool will allow you to explore and compare fees reported to the Texas Comptroller's office by all 254 counties since 2006.

The screenshot at right shows all of the components of the S&C tool's graphic user interface.

#### Introduction


**About this tool** - The Introductory text tells you all about the tool and its capabilities.

**Clear the slate!** - If you wish to clear all your selections, press the Clear button. This is recommended if you have completed one comparison and wish to start another.

**Keeping track** - The **Current Selections** box keeps track of all selections you make when you choose which counties, fees, etc. you wish to explore. You can click the small eraser icons to remove unwanted selections.

A little help here! - If you get lost, or just need a little help navigating, select the On-Screen Help button to see some pointers.

Note: When you first open the S&C tool, the default selections are 2018, Anderson County, and Writ & Order of Sale.




#### **Data Selection Area**

#### **Exploring Data**

Exploring data is as easy as 1...2...3! You can explore in 4 different ways:

- by Year
- by Economic Region
- by County
- by Fee Type



#### **The Data Visualization Area**

The Data Visualization Area displays the results of your selections.

This screen shows the default selections:


- Year 2018
- County Anderson
- Fee Type Writ & order of Sale

The Y axis shows HOW MUCH or HOW MANY.

The X axis shows WHEN and WHO.

**Undo button.** Each click of the Undo button takes you one step back.

**Fee Name legend.** Note the fee names are color coded.



## Hover, Drill, Toggle

You can hover over the bars in the visualization to see more details.



### Hover, Drill, Toggle (continued)

You can narrow down the results by clicking and dragging over the Fees you want to see.

Note: You may also select the fee types individually from the Fee Type list.



## **Hover, Drill, Toggle (continued)**

Click Undo to go back a step.




### Hover, Drill, Toggle (continued)

Click the toggle button to view this same data in a straight table.

Then toggle back to the bar chart.

Note: You can right-click on your chart or table to print it or export to Excel.



#### **Data Summary and Contact Tables**

#### Tables - Print or Export your Data

There are two data tables at the bottom of the tool.

The first table contains data based on your selections above.

The second table contains contact information for the selected counties.


You can use the icons on the right to print or export the data to Excel.

#### **Show Me More**

Now we'll demonstrate how you can explore multiple years and see how fees are trending over time.

We'll also compare multiple counties and show you how the Economic Regions feature works.

Finally, we'll demonstrate how you can zoom into specific portions of the data using drill down technology.




#### **Show Me More**




## **Explore Multiple Years**

#### Let's be clear.

To begin any new data exploration, we should start by selecting the Clear button.

This removes all current data selections.



#### See the trends.

Now we'll select multiple years to see how things have trended over time. Select all 13 years.




## Choose a county.

Let's start with one county, then we'll add some more.

Select Travis County.

Now we'll scroll down to the Data Visualization Area.



#### See the trend line.

You can see how the fees for Travis County have trended gradually upward for the last several years.

Now let's add a county to compare to Travis.



## Add another county.

Let's select Williamson County from the list.


Now let's scroll back to the visualization area to compare the two selected counties.

#### **Explore Multiple Counties**

#### Compare trend lines.

Wow. These counties have two very different trends in their fee structure!

While Travis county fees exhibit a gradual upward trend, the Williamson County fees show a dramatic spike upward in 2009, followed by a dramatic spike downward in 2012.




#### **Compare trend lines.**

### **Explore Economic Regions**


#### See all the counties in your region.

The regional map enables you to select all the counties in your region with just one click.

We'll click the Clear button and begin a new data exploration based on a specific economic region.


#### Select the Capital Region.

Note: You may choose an economic region by clicking the map or selecting from the Economic Regions list.



## Counties and fee types are highlighted.

Now all the counties in the Capital Region are highlighted in the County list, and all fee types associated with those counties are highlighted in the Fee Type list.




#### Compare counties in your region.

In the data visualization area, we now see all the fee data for the counties in the Capital Region.

The graph displays the counties alphabetically from left to right, three at a time.

We can scroll the graph to the right to see more counties.



#### Isolate two of the counties.

Let's take another look at Travis and Williamson counties. With the mouse, we can drag-select them to zoom in.

#### **Use the Drill Down Features Isolate Fees** Now we'll take a closer look at what these two counties charge for various kinds of writs. We'll use drag-select to choose all the writs SHERIFFS' and CONSTABLES' FEES from the Fee Name legend. We've now isolated the writ fees for Travis and Williamson counties, and can easily compare them. Note that currently (2018), Travis has many different kinds of writ fees with varying costs, while Williamson has assigned one cost to all of their writs.

#### **Isolate Fees**
