It is our pleasure to submit to you the Education and Outreach Report for the Statewide Historically Underutilized Business (HUB) Program, as required by Texas Government Code § 2161.126.

This report describes educational and outreach activities conducted in the past year to increase HUB certification and educate minority, women and service-disabled veteran owned businesses about the state's procurement methods to create more opportunities for HUBs.

During the past year, we hosted the Procurement Connection Seminar and HUB Expo event in Austin, and co-hosted another economic opportunity forum in Irving.

We incorporated educational and networking workshops into our events to provide vendors with in-depth information on the state's procurement process; opportunities to interact with state HUB coordinators and purchasers; and information related to HUB resources, including the Centralized Master Bidder List (CMBL), Electronic State Business Daily (ESBD), HUB Subcontracting Plan and HUB Reporting.

We remain committed to increasing awareness of the state's HUB program and expanding contract opportunities for minority, women and service-disabled veteran owned businesses across Texas.

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Introduction

Minority, women-owned, and service-disabled veteran owned businesses continue to be a vital element of Texas' thriving economy. By obtaining Historically Underutilized Business (HUB) certification and increasing their knowledge of the state government's procurement process, these businesses significantly increase their chances of winning state contracts or being considered for a vast number of subcontracting opportunities. The Statewide HUB Program is tasked with ensuring the integrity of the certification and compliance of these companies and providing information on the state's procurement process.

Texas Government Code §2161.126 requires the Statewide HUB Program to report to the governor, lieutenant governor and speaker of the House on its education and outreach efforts by the end of the fiscal year. This report reflects numbers from September 1, 2018 through August 31, 2019 of the fiscal year.

By the end of August 2019, nearly 13,500 firms were registered as Texas-certified HUBs businesses.

The 2009 Texas Disparity Study confirms the need for the continuation of the Statewide HUB Program. This conclusion is based primarily on:

 statistical disparities by race, ethnicity and gender classification in current HUB utilization, particularly in prime contracting;

- statistical disparities by race, ethnicity and gender classification in the private marketplace, particularly in the area of utilization of women- and minorityowned firms in commercial construction;
- statistical disparities in firm earnings by race, ethnicity and gender classification, even after controlling for capacity-related factors; and
- anecdotal testimony of disparate treatment as presented by business owners in interviews, surveys, public hearings and focus groups.

In conducting the study and preparing recommendations, MGT followed a carefully designed work plan that allowed its study team members to fully analyze availability, utilization, and disparity with regard to HUB participation. MGT's approach has been tested in over 125 jurisdictions and proven reliable in meeting the study's objectives.

The program continues to review and enhance its outreach efforts and materials, ensuring that we meet the needs of our target audience. The program's website continues to serve as a vital repository of information and resources for the vendor community, resulting in more than 98,807 total site page views between September 1, 2018 and August 31, 2019.



Vision, Mission and Philosophy

The Statewide HUB Program works to certify all eligible Texas businesses as HUBs and to increase the share of Texas state government contracts that are awarded HUBs.

The vision is supported by our mission and philosophy: to encourage and increase the use of HUB vendors in state purchasing and to provide minority, women-owned, and service-disabled veteran owned businesses with useful information on the state's procurement process.

Education and outreach components of the Statewide HUB Program in support of our vision, mission and philosophy include the following:

- Providing information to minority, women-owned, and service-disabled veteran owned businesses regarding Statewide HUB Program initiatives;
- Educating these companies about opportunities to do business with the state of Texas;
- Assisting state agencies and institutions of higher education with HUB education and outreach efforts;

- Developing and administering HUB rules and statues to ensure full and equal access to state contracting opportunities for minority, women, and servicedisabled veteran owned businesses;
- Administering the program's certification and compliance functions; and
- Compiling the state of Texas expenditure data to prepare HUB utilization reports for benchmarking HUB performance in state contracting. Gathering proposal/bids received and awarded to vendors – including HUBs. The HUB reports are provided to the legislature twice annually (May 15th and November 15th).

As noted in our Fiscal 2019 Education and Outreach Report, the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts retained MGT of America, an independent consulting firm, to determine if there is a compelling interest to continue a narrowly tailored HUB program, as required by the U. S. Supreme Court. The 2009 Texas Disparity Study confirms the need for the continuation of the Statewide HUB Program.



Policies on Education, Outreach and Information Dissemination

The Statewide HUB Program's education, outreach and information dissemination policy is to promote full and equal opportunities for all businesses involved in state contracting, in accordance with the goals specified in the Texas Disparity Study. The program works closely with Texas HUBS, partner organizations, state agencies and institutions of higher education to increase HUB participation in state contracts and to generate new contracting opportunities.

The Statewide HUB Program employs a variety of marketing strategies and materials designated to provide clear and concise details and instructions based on our targeted audience's needs. We provide this information through general and detailed presentations, electronic materials provided online for a 24-hour access, video training, one-on-one assistance over the phone and in person, through staffed exhibit booths at outreach events and conferences conducted statewide, and on-site compliance visits at the HUBs place of business.

The Statewide HUB Program has collaborated with the Office of the Governor's Texas Economic Development staff to deliver presentations and training workshops on the HUB Certification and State Contracting Opportunities. On March 29, 2019, the Statewide HUB Manager delivered a Marketing to the State presentation at the Governor's Small Business Forum in Harlingen.

The Governor's Small Business Forums feature private and public resources, practical solutions, best practices, and expert assistance on a broad range of business topics and challenges. The forums celebrate small businesses, including minority, women and service-disabled veteran business owners and entrepreneurs. The events aim to provide small business owners and aspiring entrepreneurs with timely, relevant, actionable advice on how to start, grow and sustain their businesses. The Small Business Forums are also an opportunity to network with other entrepreneurs, business owners, managers, and business-oriented non-profits, as well as local, state and federal agencies.

The statewide outreach effort teamed with the El Paso Contracting Opportunities Center Procurement Technical Assistance Center (PTAC) for the El Paso Community College Contracting Opportunities Expo, and participated in with a focus on service-disabled veteran owned HUBs, and in East Texas at Nacogdoches for the Governor's Small Business Forum on August 15, 2019.

The Governor's Small Business Forums in the Panhandle were in Plainview and Alpine at Sul Ross University. The Procurement Technical Assistance Center at Del Mar College in Corpus Christi had their staff members show how to use the CPA web site to assist customers looking for state procurement opportunities on the Electronic State Business Daily (ESBD), and made their customers aware of the HUB Certification for small minority, woman and service-disabled veteran owned businesses. The Statewide HUB Program conducted a presentation at Del Mar College on August 7, 2019 on the HUB Certification and resources available on the Statewide HUB Program's website.

The Comptroller of Public Accounts has made a concerted effort to provide HUBS with the resources they need to understand the state's purchasing processes and to improve their business opportunities to pursue state contracts.

These efforts include: explaining and detailing the HUB Certification process, educating HUBs on subcontracting opportunities, encouraging them to keep their HUB profiles updated, and tracking and researching state agency purchases to identify new opportunities. The Statewide HUB Program's outreach events are also aimed at allowing Texas HUBs to make contacts with the state of Texas HUB Coordinators and key procurement personnel, to assist HUBs to learn of the procurement opportunities available at the different state agencies.

The Statewide HUB Program's goal is to provide HUB vendors with web based video training on different topics to provide the necessary tools to assist them in learning the benefits of the HUB Certification.



Marketing Plan

The Statewide HUB Program's marketing plan promotes certification and the benefits of being HUB certified. With the assistance of the Comptroller of Public Accounts' Communications Division, we remain committed to consistently producing publications and online web materials that are clear, concise and useful to a broad and diverse community.

The agency's Communication Division works in conjunction with the HUB Program to create and produce the marketing collateral used to promote the program's initiatives. Currently, we have expanded our marketing efforts to include utilizing social media, video promotions, and GovDelivery announcements. This enabled us to efficiently reach new vendors and educate them on the criteria, opportunities and benefits of being HUB Certified as well as utilizing HUB vendors in state procurements. We have experienced positive responses by tapping into these resources.

In addition, to these efforts, the Statewide HUB Program works closely with the HUB Discussion Workgroup and the Texas Universities HUB Coordinators Alliance committees.

These committees are informal groups of HUB Coordinators and Procurement Directors that engage in discussion to provide best practices to participating members. Their participation is key to providing feedback to the Statewide HUB Program on assisting with outreach and improving and implementing a more effective HUB Program, with the goal of increasing procurement opportunities for Texas Certified HUB vendors.

We also work with our Memorandum of Cooperation (MOC) partners – the Texas Association of African-Americans Chambers of Commerce (TAAACC) and the Texas Association Mexican-American Chambers of Commerce (TAMACC). The collaborations with the state's leading state-wide minority trade organizations assist the Statewide HUB Program to reach their respective membership to provide education on the procurement process. These MOC relationships continue to be an important aspect of our commitment to increase awareness of HUB certification as well as procurement opportunities available with the State of Texas, and provide outreach services statewide in the major metropolitan cities such as Austin, Dallas, San Antonio, Houston, and El Paso.



Goals and Objectives of the Statewide HUB Program Outreach

Economic Opportunity Forums, (EOFs) Hosted and Co-hosted

During fiscal 2019, the Statewide HUB Program hosted the Procurement Connection Seminar and HUB Expo (PCSE) in Austin (with over 446 attendees) and provided training for over 300 HUB vendors. The theme for the Procurement Connection Seminar and HUB Expo was "Aiming for Success at the HUB Expo". We encouraged vendors to ensure that their companies were certified and ready to do business with the state of Texas.

The Statewide HUB Program also co-hosted one PCSE's events in Fiscal year 2019. We co-hosted a PCSE event in Irving, Texas, in conjunction with the Dallas/Fort Worth Minority Supplier Diversity Council's Access 2019, and Senator Royce West's "Doing Business Texas Style Spot Bid Fair. Both events increased the enrollment of registered HUBs from the previous year.

Good faith efforts to ensure continuing HUB participation include the following:

- Contacted and encouraged Texas non-certified minority, women, and service-disabled veteran owned businesses to obtain Texas HUB Certification;
- Contracted and encouraged HUB vendors to review procurement opportunities on the Electronic State Business Daily;
- Included a HUB Subcontracting Plan in all formal solicitations of \$100,000 or more, to increase subcontracting opportunities with HUB vendors;
- Encouraged prime contractors to reach out and subcontract with Texas Certified HUBs;

- Responded to email and phone inquiries from HUB vendors requesting information on how to do business with state, how to obtain Texas HUB certification and how to register on the Certified Master Bidder List;
- Participated and provided trainings at the HUB
 Discussion Workgroup meetings to promote and
 enhance an effective Statewide HUB Program through
 education, networking, and proactive feedback;
- Participated in Economic Opportunity Forums
 (EOFs) throughout the state, connecting with different vendors during one-on-one sessions, to actively recruit HUB vendors and provide assistance on "How to Do Business with the State";
- Connected with vendors around the state during several roundtable matchmaking discussions and conducted presentations to promote their products and services;
- Worked diligently with the agency's Memorandum of Cooperation (MOC) partners – the Texas Association of African American Chambers of Commerce and Texas Mexican American Chamber of Commerce – to enhance education on how to do business with the Comptroller's office and the state of Texas to promote their EOFs.

The Comptroller's office will continue to strengthen the Statewide HUB Program by working to increase opportunities for HUB Participation in all categories.



Future Education and Outreach Initiatives

In Fiscal year 2020, we plan to expand on our efforts to increase the number of certified HUBs, increase state purchasing opportunities for HUBs, provide extensive training to vendors on state purchasing resources, and provide assistance and training to state agencies and institutions of higher education regarding HUB rules an related statutes, policies and procedures.

To accomplish this, we have set the following goals:

- Increasing awareness of the Statewide HUB Program;
- Increasing the number of certified HUBs;
- Increasing the number of HUBs registered on the state Centralized Master Bidder List;
- Implementing an online HUB certification process;
- Improving HUB understanding of the state's purchasing processes to increase their award opportunities

To achieve these goals, our objectives include the following:

 Networking with minority, women, and servicedisabled veteran owned business trade organizations, small business development centers, and other economic development organizations to increase awareness of the Statewide HUB Program;

- Refining and updating education and outreach materials, and expanding efforts to meet HUB needs by obtaining feedback from HUBs;
- Identifying new training opportunities, including events to reach the maximum number of potential HUBs;
- Providing extensive, specialized training and educational presentations;
- Working closely with state agencies and institutions of higher education to encourage the use of HUBs in state purchasing;
- Providing training videos for HUBs and procurement professionals; and
- Educating HUBs on the different procurement methods of state agencies and universities

We will continue to work with state HUB coordinators and procurement professionals to identify their training needs and include agency representatives in our regional seminars.

Our continued success relies on meaningful communications with Statewide HUB Program members and potential members. We will continue to evaluate additional outreach methods that are cost effective for the Statewide HUB Program and strive to reach new audiences.



Outreach Initiatives

The 12th Annual Procurement Connection Seminar and EXPO (PCSE) has grown steadily as a premier event for HUB businesses to learn about procurement opportunities available through the State of Texas. Benefits to attendees include: (i) identifying resources available to help build business capacity to pursue opportunities in the state government, and (ii) providing businesses access to the state procurement personnel to make one-on-one contacts to help build valuable relationships and identify key staff that may provide additional guidance.

For fiscal year 2019, the statewide HUB Expo theme is "Aiming for Success," providing procurement connection seminars involving a collaboration of numerous state agencies. Subject matter experts from state agencies partner with the HUB team to provide conference content, expo meet and greet opportunities and discussion workshops on topics of interest to vendors in a conference setting, including a luncheon program with interactive panel discussion and networking session. These seminars give a great opportunity for HUB vendors to network with state agency contacts, state university HUB representatives, local Austin HUB certification and compliance team members, and business contractors who provide a wealth of knowledge, education and expertise in their fields.

The Statewide Procurement Division had several staff members from various program areas from the Comptroller of Public Accounts attend the HUB Expo, including representatives from the Comptroller's Fiscal Management, Statewide HUB Program, Procurement Policy & Outreach, Texas Smartbuy and the Certified Master Bidder's List teams provided outreach services.

Members of the HUB Discussion Workgroup (consisting of various state agencies) also contributed in promoting the HUB Program throughout Texas, and assisting with the HUB Expo workshops, serving as presenters, and coordinating event activities and tasks.

The Statewide HUB Program has collaborated with the Office of the Governor, Texas Economic Development to deliver presentations and training workshops on the HUB Certification and State Contracting Opportunities statewide in various cities in the State of Texas.

Conclusion

The Statewide HUB Program has attended 56 outreach events and meetings statewide and provided 24 presentations and set up exhibit booths providing outreach services on the HUB Certification, Centralized Master Bidders List and Marketing to the State information for this report, it reflects numbers from September 1, 2018 through August 31, 2019 of the fiscal year. The goal of 80 outreach events was met for this year from the Statewide HUB Program.

A "Historically Underutilized Business"...

is at least 51% owned by a/an:

- · Asian Pacific American,
- · Black American,
- · Hispanic American,
- · Native American,
- · American woman or
- Service-disabled veteran,

and is a for-profit entity that has not exceeded the size standards prescribed by 34 TAC §20.294, has its principal place of business in Texas, and has an owner residing in Texas with a proportionate interest who actively participates in the control, operations and management of the entity's affairs.

Benefits of HUB Certification

HUB certification is free and valid for four years, provided the business continues to meet the eligibility requirements.

Your business will be listed in the Comptroller's online HUB Directory. State agencies use the HUB Directory in conjunction with the Comptroller's Centralized Master Bidders List to solicit bids from certified HUBs for state purchasing and public works contracts. Prime contractors also use the HUB Directory to identify HUBs and notify them of subcontracting opportunities.

Your business will gain exposure with the general public as well as entities that have supplier diversity programs and are searching for businesses owned by minorities, women and service-disabled veterans.






