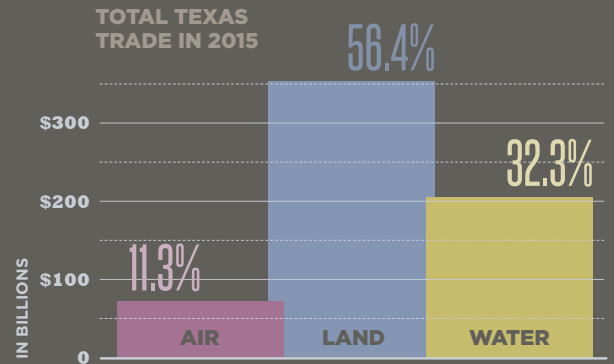
ALLIANCE GLOBAL LOGISTICS HUB

Texas' location and diverse economy offer unique trade opportunities and make it a critical gateway to global business. Our state boasts **29 OFFICIAL PORTS** of entry facilitating nearly **\$650 BILLION** in international trade in 2015. Trade through Texas supports an estimated **1.6 MILLION TEXAS JOBS** and adds **\$224.3 BILLION** to GSP annually.

Ports of entry play a crucial role in making Texas the world's **10TH LARGEST ECONOMY**. They affect every part of our state, from our largest cities to rural counties. As the state's chief financial officer, I hope highlighting their benefits will emphasize their importance to strong, diverse and growing regional economies.

ABOUT ALLIANCE

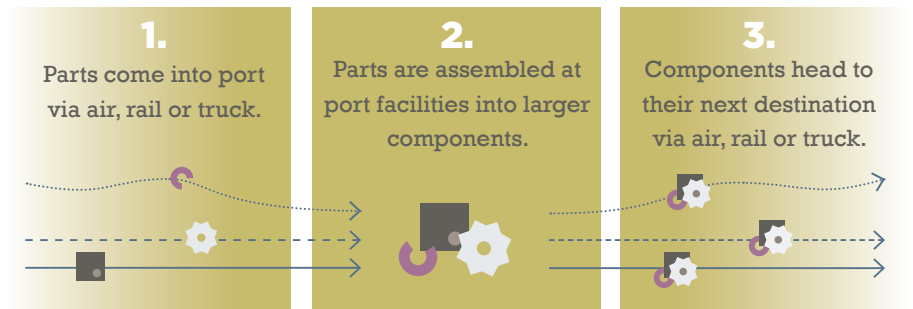
The Alliance Global Logistics Hub is part of the larger AllianceTexas development located in Fort Worth.

While the Hub does engage in some trade, the bulk of its economic activity results from it being one of two intermodal facilities in Texas. These facilities serve as important logistics hubs, providing tenants access to runways, major highways and railways.

Comptroller analysis estimates that the hub supports almost **67,000** direct and indirect Texas jobs and contributes **\$6.4 BILLION** to our gross domestic product.

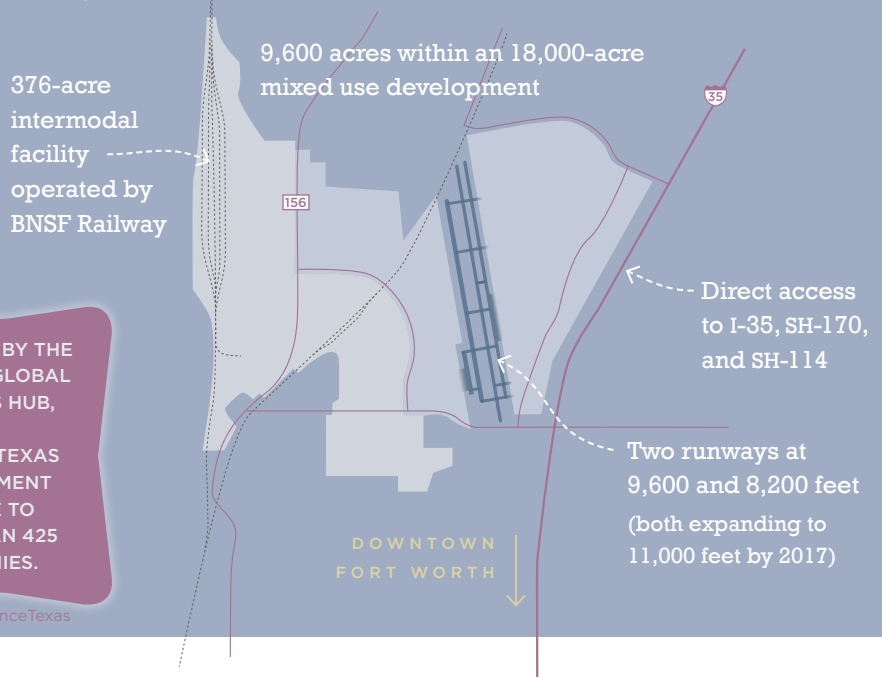
INTERMODAL FACILITY

Alliance Global Logistics Hub is one of Texas' two intermodal facilities, making it different from traditional ports. Here's how it works.



GROWING STRONG

Located on Fort Worth's north side, the Alliance Global Logistics Hub began in 1990, with the world's first industrial airport. Although its layout, location and structure differ somewhat from typical ports in our state, its features include:

TENANT HIGHLIGHT: BNSF RAILWAY

BNSF Railway is one of North America's leading freight transportation companies, operating more than 32,000 miles of track in 28 states and Canada. At Alliance Global Logistics Hub, BNSF's operation:

- EMPLOYS MORE THAN 600 WORKERS
- OFFERS DIRECT ACCESS TO WEST COAST PORTS
- HAS SIX LOADING/UNLOADING TRACKS SUPPORTED BY 12 OVERHEAD CRANES
- HANDLED MORE THAN 640,000 CARGO UNITS IN 2015
- COORDINATES NEARLY 3,000 TRUCKS AND 16 INTERMODAL TRAINS DAILY

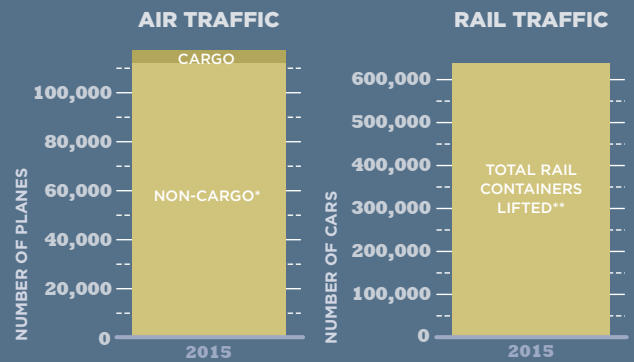

HOME SWEET PORT

A general-purpose foreign trade zone (FTZ) designation is attractive to a variety of industries. Major operations at Alliance include BNSF Railway, FedEx (Southwest Regional Hub) and other third-party logistics providers and freight forwarders.

DALLAS FORT WORTH CUSTOMS DISTRICT

Alliance Global Logistics Hub is part of the larger Dallas-Fort Worth Customs District. Trade in the district has seen steady growth in recent years.

CONCLUSION

The Alliance Global Logistics Hub has integrated access to trade and services from air, road and rail, making it unique among Texas' 29 ports. Because of its role as an intermodal facility, the hub's actual trade totals are less than traditional ports. But its contributions to the Texas economy are notable: nearly **67,000 JOBS** and more than **\$10.9 BILLION** in economic activity in 2015.

The distinctive characteristics and contributions of each facility at the Hub cannot always be quantified. Ongoing capital investments and recently announced expansions, however, are strong indicators of the Alliance Global Logistics Hub's economic potential.
