

Property Appraisal – Notice of Protest

REQUEST FOR SAME-DAY PROTEST HEARINGS

This document must be filed with the appraisal review board (ARB) for the appraisal district that took the action(s) you want to protest. It must not be filed with the office of the Comptroller of Public Accounts.

NOTE: This form is for use by a property owner or designated agent who wishes to have the ARB schedule hearings on protests concerning up to 20 designated properties on the same day pursuant to Tax Code Section 41.66(j). All designated properties for which same-day protest hearings are requested must be included in the same notice of protest. A property owner or designated agent may file only one request for same-day protest hearings in the same tax year. **A property owner or agent protesting a single property or not requesting same-day protest hearings may use Comptroller Form 50-132 (Property Appraisal – Notice of Protest) to file a protest with the ARB.**

ASSISTANCE: The Comptroller's office may not advise a property owner, a property owner's agent, the chief appraiser or another employee of an appraisal district on a matter that the Comptroller's office knows is the subject of a protest to the ARB.
