- The life expectancy of the equipment is affected by the volume of business and the scheduled maintenance intervals. If the appraiser deviates from the typical useful life, please comment in the comment field.
- Many automatic car washes contain small amounts of concessionary inventory value such as soft drinks and snack foods. These schedules do not provide for the varying amounts of concession inventory that may be found. The appraiser should obtain owner information for this value.
- Most automatic car washes have gasoline inventory and tanks; refer to the Gasoline Equipment \& Inventory schedule, page L-97, to estimate this value.
- Descriptions of the three types of Car Washes as they pertain to these schedules are as follows:
- Self-Service - drive-in coin-operated washes which have bays or stalls.
- Drive-Thru - small single-car drive-through automated washes generally found at service stations and/or convenience stores/food booths.
- Automatic - multiple-car, full-service buildings which include a finished office area, restrooms, and equipment room. Fair quality classification represents semi-automatic washes while the good car wash is fully automated with on-site personnel for interior cleaning, before and after the wash.

## Automatic Car Washes (7542)

The cost of equipment for automatic car washes can vary significantly depending on the quality and care of equipment used. When valuing this type of property, the appraiser should make every effort to obtain owner information on equipment cost and depreciation. In addition, it should be noted that state-of-the-art robotics and laser technology in some new car washes could greatly increase the total cost of equipment over the Package Costs listed below.

As a general guide, Fair quality would be semi-automatic equipment with a minimal corrosive protection and limited automation. Average quality would include more automated equipment on the wash line and personnel for cleaning after the exterior wash. Good quality would provide a fully-automated wash line utilizing high quality and very durable equipment. It would also provide personnel both before and after wash for interior and exterior cleaning and finish.

The following covers all equipment costs for standard automatic car washes, but does not include building improvements, service station equipment, paving, signs, etc. For a detailed breakdown of individual equipment costs see Unit Costs table following this chart:

The pipe costs listed are averages of installed costs per linear foot including contractor's overhead and profit, but excluding any design layout costs or fees. The two pipe sizes listed refer to the interior diameter of the pipe. The sizes and type of pipe listed were found to be the most typical for connecting underground storage tanks to gas pumps.

For complex or intricate design layout and installations, costs may be $15 \%$ to $25 \%$ higher. For long straight runs with minimum fittings, costs may be $15 \%$ to $25 \%$ lower.

Most installations are with plastic piping. The quality of the subject property will indicate the quality of the pipe used. Installations 10 years old or more may have installed black steel or galvanized pipes.

In environmentally sensitive areas, secondary containment lines may be required. If such containment lines exist, add $30 \%$ to $50 \%$ to the base cost.

Excavation and fill is ranked by the difficulty in working with the soil and the site. If the soil is such that it is easy to dig and the site allows for maneuverability of equipment to operate on the site, then the "1" ranking should be used. As the difficulty of working with the soil and/or the site increases, so should the cost or ranking for excavation and backfill. Hard soil or rock would be the " 4 " ranking.

Depreciate piping with tanks over a $20-\mathrm{yr}$. life.

Costs are averages for completely-installed tanks, including fittings, access manway, excavation and backfill.

For multiple installations, two or more tanks in one hole, deduct $7 \%$ for each extra tank, considering the largest tank in the hole as the base.

The schedule is designed to allow flexibility in terms of type and capacity of the tank. The user can choose a total cost, cost per gallon, or the overall average cost per gallon.

Most tanks are steel. However, newer installations owned by major oil companies typically install fiberglass tanks.

Add \$2,600 per tank for leakage monitoring system.
