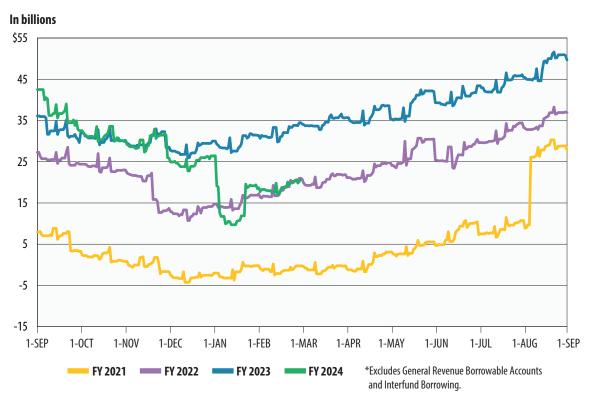

#### GENERAL REVENUE FUND DAILY BALANCES\*



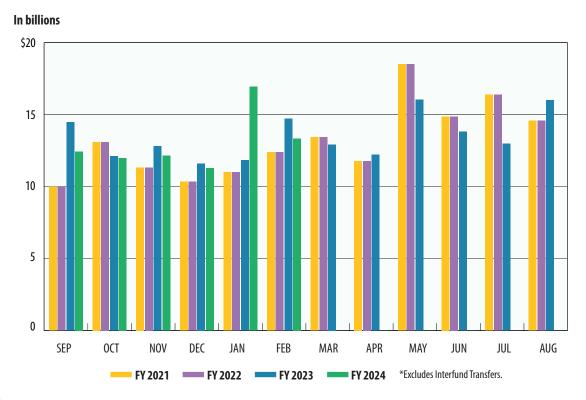


#### GENERAL REVENUE FUND NET CASH FLOW\*



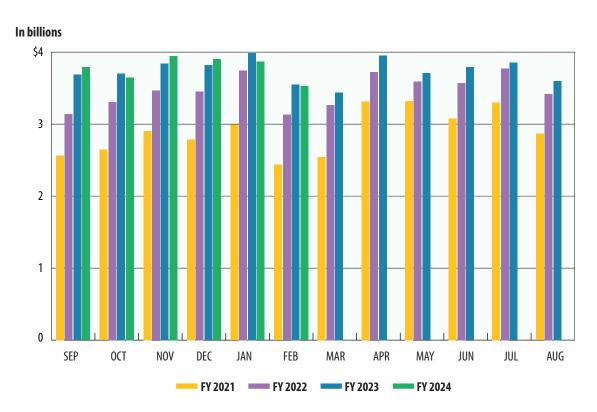

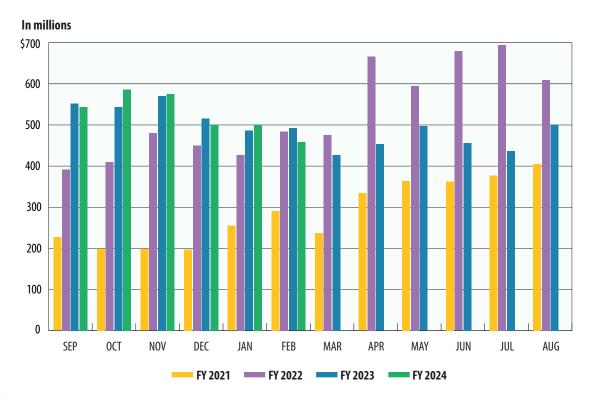


## SALES TAX



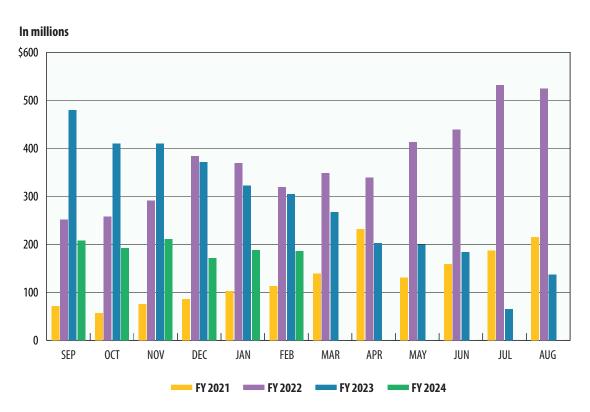


#### OIL PRODUCTION TAX



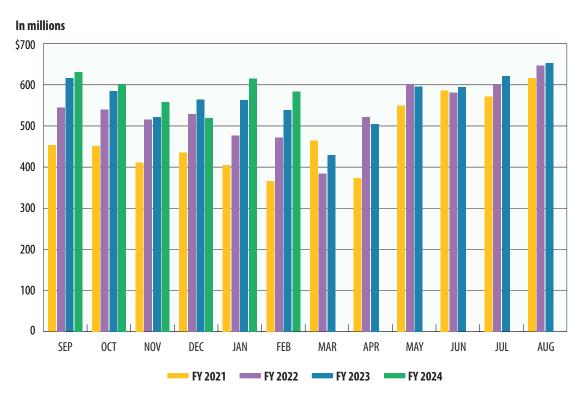


#### NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION TAX



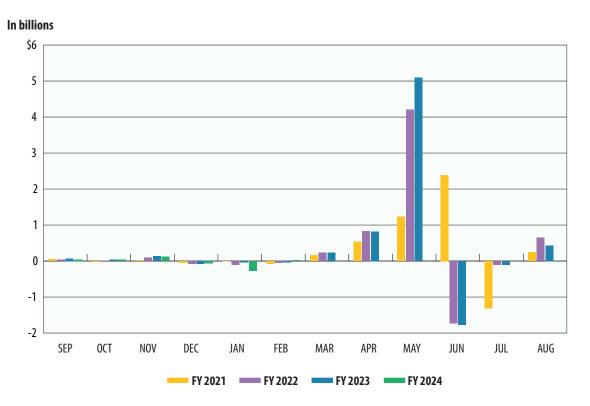


#### MOTOR VEHICLE SALES/RENTAL TAX





#### FRANCHISE TAX



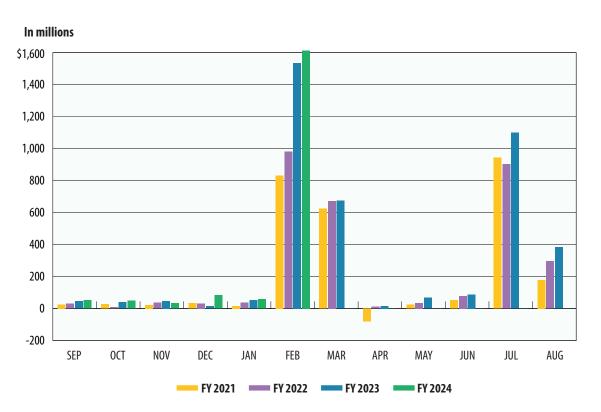


#### MOTOR FUELS TAXES



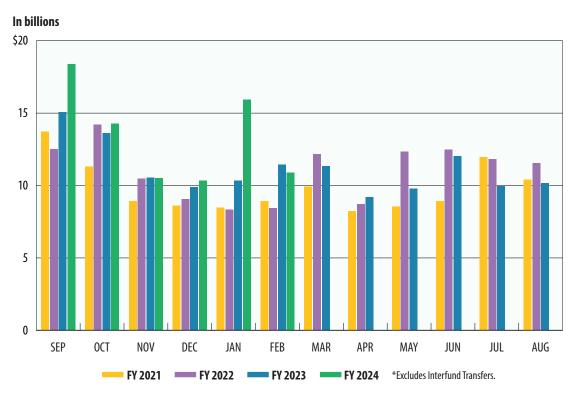


#### INSURANCE TAXES



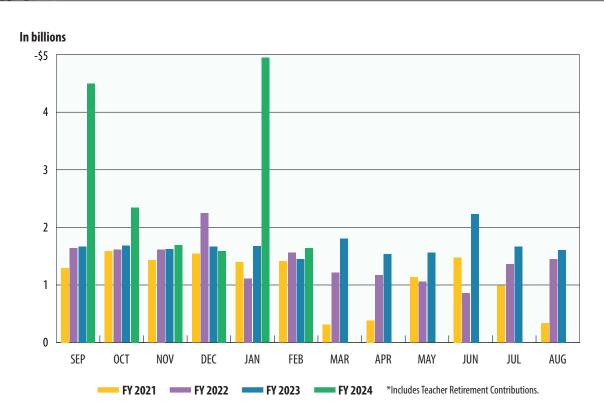

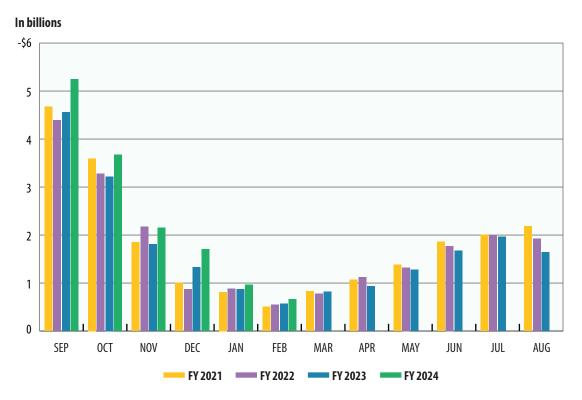


#### PAYROLL/BENEFITS EXPENDITURES\*



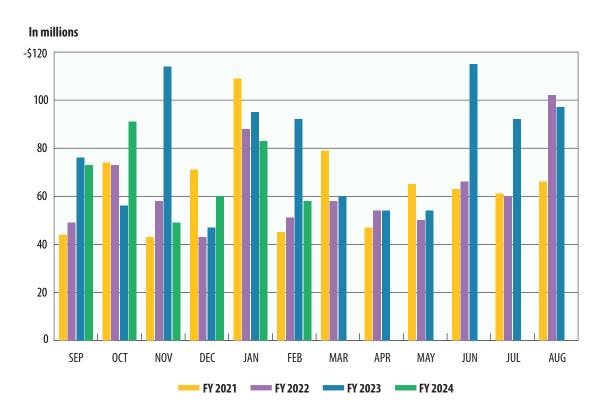


#### PUBLIC EDUCATION EXPENDITURES



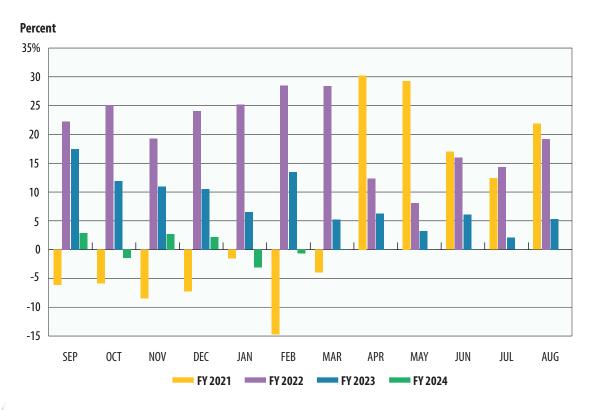


#### LOTTERY TICKET SALES



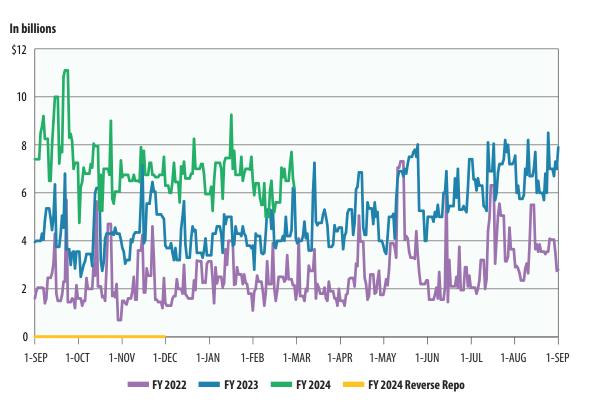


## SALES TAX COLLECTIONS (PERCENT CHANGE OVER SAME MONTH PRIOR YEAR)
